THE DATA PROTECTION ACT

Regulations made by the Minister, after consultation with the Commissioner, under section 55 of the Data Protection Act 2017

- **1.** These regulations may be cited as the Data Protection (Fees) Regulations 2020.
- 2. In these regulations
 - "Act" means the Data Protection Act 2017.
- **3.** For the purpose of section 16(2) of the Act, the fee for the issue of a registration certificate shall be as specified in the Schedule.
- **4.** For the purpose of section 18(2) of the Act, the fee for the issue of a new registration certificate shall be as specified in the Schedule.
- **5.** For the purpose of section 20(3)(b) of the Act, the fee payable for a certified copy of, or an extract from, any entry in the register shall be as specified in the Schedule.
- **6.** For the purpose of section 37(7) of the Act, the fee relating to a request which is manifestly excessive shall be as specified in the Schedule.
- 7. For the purpose of section 52(4) of the Act, the fee payable for an appeal shall be as specified in the Schedule.
- **8.** The Data Protection Regulations 2009 are revoked.
- **9.** These regulations shall come into operation on 1 August 2020.
