Young Talent Competition 2014

The Financial Services Commission ('FSC') launched the Young Talent Competition ('YTC') 2014 at

the FSC House on 14 March 2014. The third edition of the YTC was officially launched by Ms.

Clairette Ah-Hen, the Chief Executive of the FSC in the presence of Mr. Manoj Appado, Board

Member of the FSC, industry representatives, as well as, representatives and students of secondary

schools from public and private institutions.

In her welcoming message, the Chief Executive encouraged the students to participate actively in the

Competition, and added that through their participation, they can contribute with the FSC in building

the capacity for Mauritians to develop the financial services sector. Ms Clairette Ah-Hen explained that

the sector is a service-oriented one which depends largely on the knowledge and skills of people. She

highlighted that the YTC is an opportunity for students to build a relation with the FSC.

The objective of this annual Competition is to create and enhance awareness of the financial services

sector amongst the youth. The main theme for the YTC 2014 is "The Mauritius International

Financial Centre (IFC)". The Mauritius IFC has forged, over the years, a solid reputation as a credible

and trusted jurisdiction, and the FSC's Vision is "to be an internationally recognised Financial

Supervisor committed to the sustained development of Mauritius as a sound and competitive Financial

Services Centre".

The YTC 2014 will be divided into two categories - Category 1 with a Quiz Competition for

participants of Form IV and V; and Category 2 with an Essay Competition for participants of Lower

and Upper VI. The closing date for application is by the 1st April 2014. The final results will be

published on Monday 16th June 2014. Winners for the first prize will receive a cash prize of Rs 20, 000

per participant, and the runners-up will receive a cash prize of Rs 10, 000 per participant. Application
