Public Consultation - Draft Insurance (Insurance Aggregators) Regulations

In line with its strategy to sustain the growth of the fintech ecosystem in Mauritius, the Financial Services Commission, Mauritius ("FSC") is proposing to establish a comprehensive regulatory framework for Insurance Aggregators, which will give a boost to the insurance sector namely through the involvement of new and innovative operators.

This Communiqué is consequently being issued to inform stakeholders of the financial services industry that the FSC has proposed to the Ministry of Financial Services and Good Governance that the regulatory framework for Insurance Aggregators be issued by way of Regulations under section 78A of the Insurance Act.

Accordingly, the FSC is hereby publishing the [draft Insurance \(Insurance Aggregators\) Regulations](#) for public consultation. It is to be noted that the provisions of the draft Regulations do not reflect the final stand of the Authorities in Mauritius. The proposed regulatory framework for Insurance Aggregators may be revised in light of the views and comments received during this consultation exercise.
