Launching of the Research Seminar Series under the FSC Academy

The Financial Services Commission, Mauritius (FSC), kickstarted the inaugural session of the FSC Research Seminar Series under the FSC Academy on Tuesday 18 November 2025. The session on the theme: "Al Projects in Financial Supervisory Authorities" was attended with over 100 participants including representatives from the Bank of Mauritius, Ministry of Financial Services and Economic Planning, the Financial Services Institute and staff of the FSC.

In his welcoming note, the Chief Executive of the FSC, Désiré Vencatachellum, highlighted the rationale for the setting up of the FSC Academy, with the aim of giving staff the proper skills to excel in their career. He further underscored on how the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) is transforming the world and that the Commission cannot be left behind in this journey.

The seminar was conducted by Ms Gabriela Conde, Senior Financial Sector Expert from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) who presented a paper she coauthored on Al Projects in Financial Supervisory Authorities: A Toolkit for Successful Implementation. During the presentation, Ms Conde highlighted the key factors to ensure the successful implementation



of Al Projects in a Supervisory Authority including on how to manage such projects

ranging from project foundation through data understanding and preparation, modelling

and evaluation, to deployment.

This was followed by an interactive Q & A session moderated by Mr Deerajen

Ramasawmy, Assistant Director, Financial Stability & Statistics Cluster at the FSC.

to share views on financial regulatory matters. It will be an opportunity for external

speakers to spread awareness, knowledge and best practices on policy and regulatory
