

REGISTRATION OF POTENTIAL SUPPLIERS

The Financial Services Commission, Mauritius (the "FSC") is inviting interested parties to register themselves for provision of goods, services, works and consultancy services at the FSC.

The Supplier Registration Form may be downloaded from the FSC's website https://www.fscmauritius.org/en/media-corner/procurement and duly filled form should be forwarded by email on procurement@fscmauritius.org

The list of goods and services is non-exhaustive and any supplier/service provider is encouraged to make his business known to us.

Prices of goods/services should not be submitted at this stage.

Prospective suppliers/service providers should take note of the following:

- FSC will have no contractual obligations towards any potential applicants following submission of form; and
- This exercise shall not entitle applicants to become exclusive suppliers/service providers of the FSC

e-Procurement System

As announced in the Budget Speech 2020/2021 of the Government of Mauritius, the e-Procurement System (e-PS) is mandatory for public sector bodies as from 1st July 2020.

Suppliers/service providers are requested to register on the e-PS as **registration is mandatory** for a supplier to submit a bid online.

You may wish to refer to the manual and video available on the "How to?" menu for information about registration on the e-PS website on https://eproc.publicprocurement.govmu.org/login.

Furthermore, it is **mandatory for bidders** to use a Digital Signature Certificate (DSC) for encryption/decryption of their bid data and for digital signing of bids. A DSC for the e-Procurement Class can be purchased from the Certification Authority, eMudhra through Mauritius Post Ltd by applying online on the following website, https://www.emudhra.mu/.
