FAKE FSC DOCUMENTS

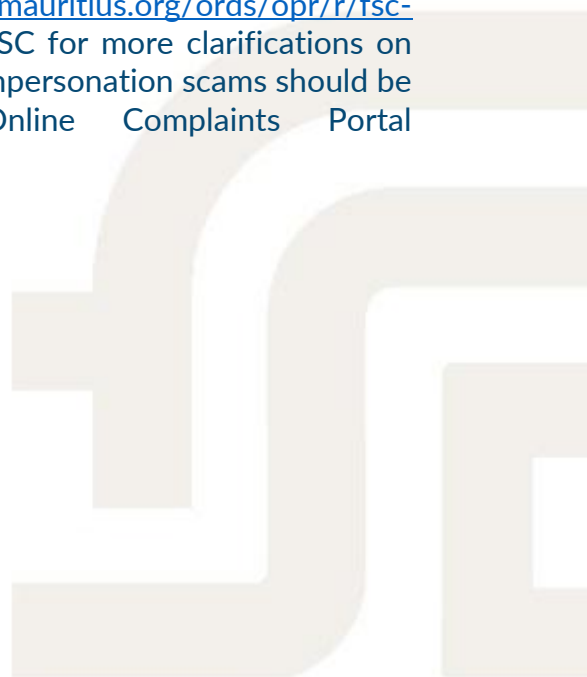
The Financial Services Commission, Mauritius (FSC) has become aware of fraudulent documents issued in its name, which are being circulated among members of the public. These documents, presented in the form of [certificates](#) and [letters](#) which bear the name, logo and/or address of the FSC, **falsely** purport to have been issued by the FSC and fraudulently solicit the payment of funds from members of the public.

The FSC hereby informs members of the public that it **has not, at any time, issued or authorised the issuance of such documents**. Members of the public are therefore urged to exercise utmost caution in respect of any such documents, as well as in relation to any person who falsely claims to represent the FSC, its officials, or to be affiliated or otherwise associated with the FSC.

In order to verify the authenticity and legitimacy of such documents, members of the public are requested to contact the FSC through its official website (<https://www.fscmauritius.org/contact-us>). Members of the public are also advised to refrain from transferring, remitting or otherwise providing funds in response to any such documents or requests.
